



Draft Budget 2023 – Ward 5 – West Carleton-March Councillor Clarke Kelly

Ward investments in 2023

Infrastructure

- \$2.2 million to renew roads, including portions of Craig's Side Road, Old Second Line Road, Pineridge Road, Tall Forest Drive and Upper Dwyer Hill Road
- \$230,000 to preserve paving on portions of Loggers Way and Old Almonte Road
- \$3.8 million to renew 37 drainage culverts
- \$300,000 to design 14 drainage culverts
- \$390,000 to renew a bridge structure on Limestone Road
- \$1 million to upgrade the Carp Wastewater pump station
- \$650,000 to renew sidewalks on portions of Fitzroy Street and Harbour Street

Parks, recreation and culture

- \$637,000 to replace or rehabilitate parks, recreation and cultural facilities, including:
 - \$160,000 to replace equipment at Erskine Johnston Arena
 - \$200,000 to replace windows at the West Carleton Community Complex
 - \$277,000 to improve the Carp Highlands Pathway, Constance and Buckham's Bay Community Centre Park (accessible swings), Rivington and Langstaff Park (benches) and Sheila McKee Park (hydro connection)
- \$384,000 to build Carp Airport Community Park, part of a multi-year investment of nearly \$1.4 million

Transportation

- \$2.9 million to design the widening of Carp Road between Highway 417 and Hazeldean Road
- \$100,000 for a functional design study for intersection and traffic control changes at March Road and Donald B. Munro Drive/Old Carp Road
- \$100,000 for a functional design study for intersection changes at March Road and Dunrobin Road
- \$680,000 to pave David Manchester Road between Richardson Side Road and Highway 7

Emergency services

- \$70,000 to replace windows at Fire Station 61 in Kinburn
